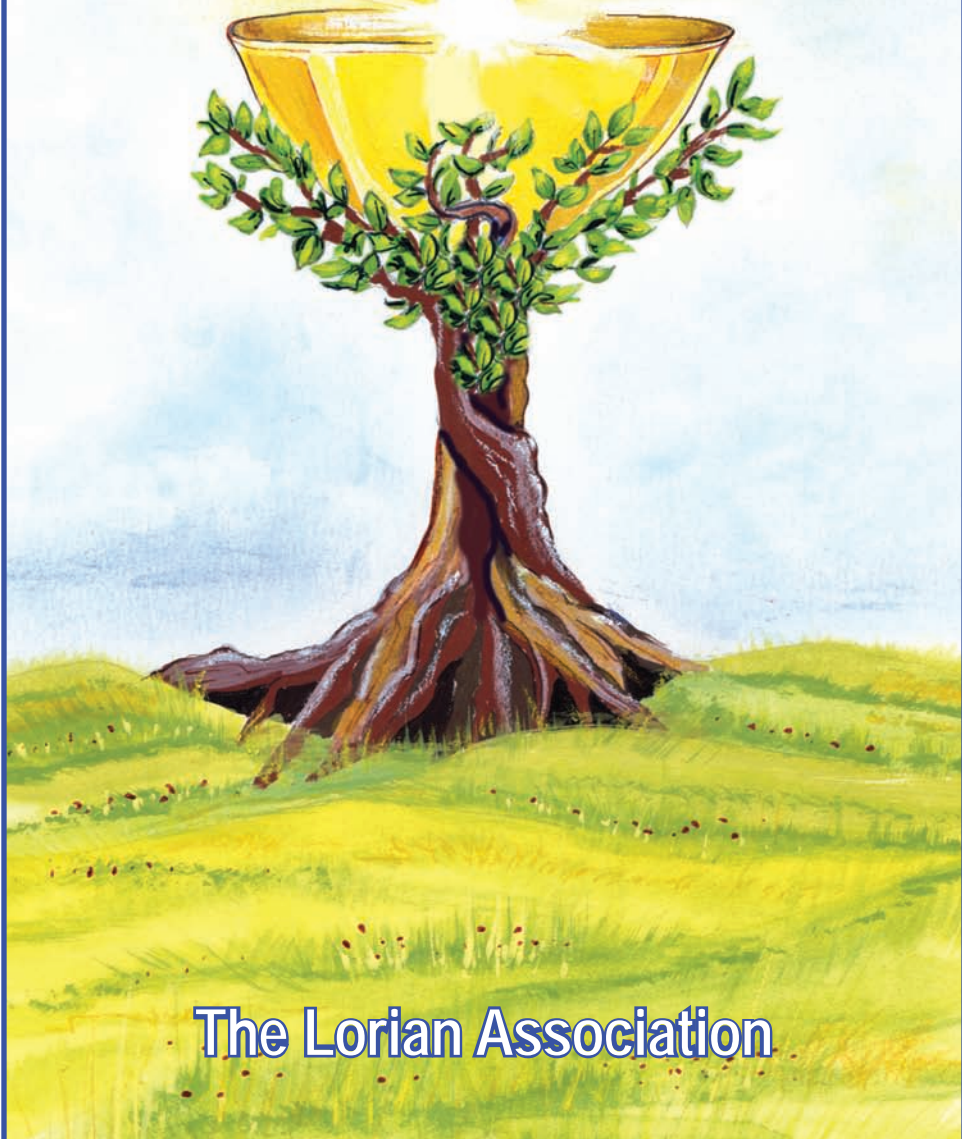

Part One: Overview

A Holistic Spiritual Practice for the 21st Century

Incarnational Spirituality

These times call for a contemporary spirituality that honors the sacredness of incarnation. This sacredness manifests in the unique life of each individual, in the co-creative life of a group, and in the sanctity of the earth itself. It means honoring the physical world and its qualities as fully as the spiritual and transcendental realms. Incarnational Spirituality expresses the integrative synthesis of the transpersonal and the personal, the universal and the local, the individual and the group, and the sacred and the ordinary.

Incarnation is about creating a living chalice of consciousness, relationship, spirit, and action. It is about the holding of spirit in the midst of matter; it is about holding matter in the presence of spirit. It is about holding oneself in a loving wholeness and others likewise. It is about holding the earth in honor and respect, in partnership and collaboration. Incarnational spirituality offers a set of ideas, principles and techniques to assist in these acts of Holding.

Whatever other causes there may be or appear to be, our failure to hold in these ways, our failure to be incarnated in a holistic manner, is a contributing factor in the problems and challenges our world faces.

Rectifying this failure is the spiritual challenge of the contemporary world and it calls for individuals who can:

- Discover the sacredness within their own lives
- Stand as an agent of blessing and transformation in the world
- Practice the art of co-creativity
- Offer individual gifts into spiritual service, enhancing self, other and the world
- Pioneer an emergent, loving, holistic spirituality

The goal of Incarnational Spirituality is to support and empower such individuals.

Discovering Incarnational Spirituality

There are four ways of discovering and learning about Incarnational Spirituality and what it has to offer to you.

General Reading: The Lorian Bookstore, found on the Lorian Association website, has many books, card decks, and self-study modules on Incarnational Spirituality and related topics. The simplest way to discover Incarnational Spirituality is to browse the material that is available and read what attracts you.

Individual Classes and Workshops: The second way is to take a class or workshop offered by one or more of the Lorian faculty. These classes are most often presented online but face-to-face workshops in various locations are offered from time to time as well. As described below, they may be “Core programs” or “Application programs.” The basic introductory Core class is *An Overview of Incarnational Spirituality*; this class is offered online at least four times a year. The Lorian website offers a schedule of all upcoming classes, workshops and other events such as special conferences or seminars.

Facilitated Self-Study: The third way is to study the six-part *Path of the Chalice*. This is a set of flexible, facilitated learning modules which may be studied individually or together taken up as a coordinated program of individual development, integration and practice. This can be done entirely at an individual’s own pace. A facilitator is available at all stages of the program to assist in the integration and understanding of the material and its specific application within the individual’s own unique life and circumstances.

Pre-Ordination Certificate Study: The fourth way is to enroll in the Lorian Center for Incarnational Spirituality and to take the *Path of the Chalice* Program for a *Certificate of Incarnational Study*. This Certificate is a prerequisite for taking the Lorian Ordination Program.

No matter what level you choose to engage with Incarnational Spirituality, the objective of all our programs is not to promote another philosophy in the world but to give you a toolbox that you can use to build a strong, whole,

integrated, and spiritually attuned incarnation, one that blesses you and blesses the world we all share.

Core and Application

Incarnational Spirituality is a vast area of learning, practice and application. The programs that explore it and offer instruction and insights fall naturally into two categories: Core programs and Application programs.

Core programs are those offered by the Lorian Center for Incarnational Spirituality and include the *Path of the Chalice*, the *Certificate of Incarnational Study* program, and the Ordination program. These programs focus on the foundational elements of Incarnational Spirituality and are described below.

Application programs are those offered by the teachers and faculty of the Lorian Association that apply the principles of Incarnational Spirituality, often within specific professions. The theme and focus of an Application program may not be Incarnational Spirituality itself, but these programs all draw on the foundational elements and principles taught in the Core programs, elaborating and developing them in particular ways according to the intent of the teacher. Such programs may be single events, such as a workshop or lecture, or they may be ongoing trainings within a specific discipline or application. It is in these Application programs that Incarnational Spirituality configures itself to the diversity of the world. An individual may discover Incarnational Spirituality through one of these Application programs and then be inspired to delve more deeply by taking one or more of the Core programs.

Core Programs

Lorian Center for Incarnational Spirituality

The Lorian Center for Incarnational Spirituality supervises the Core educational programs of Incarnational Spirituality. Its work is designed for those wishing to deepen their study of Incarnational Spirituality into a professional life practice. It offers two levels of programs, each a pre-requisite for the one following. These levels can be combined into a two-stage program if the individual wishes to do so.

Stage One: The Path of the Chalice Certificate Program

The *Certificate of Incarnational study* program can be taken as a formal pre-requisite for entering the Ordination program, or simply to gain a Certificate that testifies to an individual's accomplishment and mastery of the basic elements of Incarnational Spirituality.

Stage Two: Ordination Program

The Lorian Association offers an eighteen-month long Ordination track for those called to spiritual service as an agent of Incarnational Spirituality. It emphasizes holding space for others as a celebrant of the sacred and serving as an agent of the spirit of incarnation in daily life and practices. An Application is required outlining the reasons the candidate is seeking ordination and their understanding of their spiritual call. A prerequisite is Lorian's *Certificate of Incarnational Study* or equivalent.

Part Two: Program Descriptions

The Path of the Chalice Incarnational Worldview and Practice

The premise of Incarnational Spirituality is simple but it has profound consequences. We can each produce unique spiritual energies and qualities that can create wholeness in ourselves, in our relationships, and in the world at large. This generative capacity arises in part because of our innate spiritual nature and in part due to the process of incarnation itself which focuses and enhances this capacity. Through partnership and collaboration with the intrinsic spiritual forces of the world, as well as with each other, we can augment our generative powers, becoming even more powerful sources of blessing, healing and wholeness. Understanding this, we are called to assist in the collective incarnations of humanity and the world itself, doing a “work of Gaia” that can help shape our future and the future of all life in holistic and mutually beneficial ways.

Ultimately, Incarnational Spirituality is a practice, one that a person configures uniquely to his or her own individuality and connections to the world; it is not simply a philosophy or cosmology. Its purpose is to shape actions that can heal and bless our troubled world.

The *Path of the Chalice* is the central Core program in Incarnational Spirituality. Its objective is to enable people of vision and determination to gain the understanding and skills that will allow them to engage the challenge of contemporary issues as they manifest in their own lives. Its goal is to enable an individual to heal the energetic dissonance, discord and disintegration we see in the world today as well as to create opportunities for the emergence of a positive future. Each of the six segments offers value on its own but together they blend into a program of personal spiritual practice and action that we feel can bring into the world the wholeness and blessings that are urgently needed.

We call this program “The Path of the Chalice” since at all levels, incarnation is an art of building containers—“chalices”—which can hold varying degrees and intensity of spirit and sacredness, both individually and collectively. At the heart of this program, you are learning how to identify, create and

maintain such “chalices” within yourself, in your immediate environment, with others, with the world at large, and with the subtle realms of spirit.

The *Path of the Chalice* may be studied in two ways. The first is through self-study, which a person may do entirely at his or her own pace as well as selecting the order in which the material is studied. The second is through the *Certificate of Incarnational Study* program which adds two requirements to the study: participation in Four Integration seminars and a series of writing assignments.

The *Path of the Chalice* material is ordered into the following six segments. Each includes several books and other materials by David Spangler and others designed to assist in augmenting a participant’s spiritual understanding and practice. The primary lesson materials are shown in bold type but all of the resources support a thorough understanding and embodiment of the subject. The sections are most effectively studied in the order presented and are designed as a one year or longer course of study.

Note: if a person is studying this material in order to qualify for a Certificate or for Ordination, then those shown in bold are required reading.

This Section provides an overall context for the practice of Incarnational Spirituality. It introduces some of the ways that we can align with and nurture the awakening of a new consciousness within ourselves and begin to experience the rich possibilities of our time. It gives an overview of the incarnational worldview and teaches practical means for accessing the spiritual resources that arise within each of us simply as a result of living our lives as incarnated humans. The study module includes specific practices in blessing, manifestation, and inner attunement. The overview positions your personal development and creativity in relationship with others, and in service to the world.

2. The Generative Self – Creating the Chalice of Self

This section focuses on the nature of the self as seen through the lens of Incarnational Spirituality and includes work with the incarnational card deck designed especially to help nurture a new relationship between oneself and the world. Materials speak to sovereignty, boundaries, creativity, and a new perspective on incarnation, sacredness and the generative nature of the self. Work with the card deck is a meditative process that enhances awareness, connectivity and creativity.

This section builds on the idea of the Generative Self and looks outward into the realm of relationship and the creation of “Grail Space,” a specific and powerful co-created “chalice” for holding sacredness in the environment. The incarnating self extends itself into the world through connection and engagement, and how it does so greatly determines how it may discover and release its spiritual potentials. The material in this area expands into many areas of relationships with others, including subtle activism on behalf of humanity in general and the art and practice of blessing. This work focuses on practices of engagement with others and the world that enhance and expand wholeness in our daily lives and work. Materials offer perspectives and practices in shaping energetic relationships that are healthy, clear, and life-giving.

This section expands the level of engagement and connection into the realms of subtle energy that form an invisible but interactive part of our physical environments. It explores the nature of the subtle realms of spirit that form the Earth's "other half," but focuses on those manifestations of these realms that are closest to our physical life. If the subtle worlds are a vast ocean, then the subtle environment is like the beach where that sea meets and intermingles with the land. Practical tools, particularly in what might be called "subtle energy hygiene," are offered on how to "walk the beach" and work with the subtle energies that surround us.

This section expands upon the previous section in developing an understanding of the inner landscape of Earth's invisible "other half." The emphasis here is on how a practitioner of Incarnational Spirituality might safely engage with helpful Beings from the subtle realms and form co-creative alliances. It includes the stories of several "practical" mystics and the lessons they can offer for building a solid appreciation for the diversity of non-physical life that contributes to the vitality and beauty of our world.

The Path of the Chalice

Program Requirement Details

The *Path of the Chalice* study sections are self-directed and can take as long as the participant needs to master the material. Each section includes materials central to the theme and other supplemental materials to support further learning and practice. There is no registration required to study these materials independently.

However, if you wish to gain a *Certificate of Incarnational Study* as a prerequisite for applying for the Ordination program, then there are specific requirements to be met while studying the *Path of the Chalice* materials.

Four Integrative Seminars

Regularly throughout the year, members of the Lorian faculty will offer online seminars devoted to the practice and application of Incarnational Spirituality in three content areas. The first of these Integrative Seminars is called "Incarnation Spirituality and the Way Forward". The second of these Integrative Seminars assumes a familiarity with the first 3 sections listed above. The third of these Integrative Seminars assumes a familiarity with sections 4 and 5 listed above. And the fourth Integrative Seminar assumes a familiarity with all six of the sections listed above. The emphasis is not on teaching or explaining elements of Incarnational Spirituality but on sharing and improving the understanding, practice and application of the content of the six sections.

To earn a Certificate the candidate must participate in all four of the Integrative Seminars and fulfill the writing requirements described on the following page for each of the six sections.

Writing Requirements:

1. A Three to Eight page essay outlining their understanding of the conceptual material of a particular section.
2. A summary of their work with the exercises from the study materials of the section.

3. A two to four page essay describing how the section's concepts and exercises have impacted their life.

It is strongly suggested that the writing requirements be accomplished within the Integrative Seminars. If the writing requirement is not fulfilled within the Integrative Seminar there is a \$75 additional charge for reviewing the submitted papers for each section. Within three weeks of submission of the writing assignment the participant will be formally notified by the Lorian Association if they have demonstrated completion in a particular section. If not the reasons will be stated and suggestions given for completing the section.

Cost: \$195 per Integrative Seminars (\$780 sub-total) plus any costs for Facilitation, Textbooks, Self Study Modules and other required and incidental materials. Travel costs and accommodations for those wishing to participate in a certificate graduation ceremony are also additional.

A participant can request connection with a facilitator for a section at any time. The function of the facilitator is to guide the participant in their work with the study materials and to read and respond to the participant's written work until a clear grasp of the section's content is demonstrated. \$75.00 per hour will be charged for Lorian facilitation. The participant can choose from one of the facilitators in this catalog or request that one be assigned. Scheduling between facilitator and participant will be mutually arranged between them. Payments are made to Lorian.

Additional Notes:

1. From time to time the Lorian Association hosts face-to-face workshops and live online classes covering themes within the six segments. These can be used to supplement the materials in any given section and in some cases may be used to fulfill the writing requirement online for a given section.
2. Any section can be taken independent of the certificate program.

Ordination Program

The Lorian Association offers an eighteen month Ordination track for those called to spiritual service as an agent of Incarnational Spirituality. It emphasizes attunement to the spirit of wholeness in our world, holding space for others as a celebrant of the sacred and serving as an agent of the spirit of incarnation in daily life and practices. An Application is required outlining the reasons the candidate is seeking ordination and their understanding of their spiritual call. A prerequisite is Lorian's *Certificate of Incarnational Study*.

Ordination grants the individual the right to perform marriages, funerals and to act as a minister and agent of Incarnational Spirituality and its principles. It reflects a spiritual call to service and engagement with the world based on incarnational principles. Applicants will be considered based upon their commitment to further these principles in their lives.

Since honoring the uniqueness of each individual's incarnation is a cardinal principle of Incarnational Spirituality, as much as possible the Lorian ordination program is configured to the individual candidate and the work that he or she wishes to do in the world. In effect, candidates are involved in designing their own ordination in partnership with the Lorian faculty as a way of tapping the innate sacredness and priestliness of their own souls. Ordination is the unfoldment of a seed of incarnational consciousness and planetary attunement that an individual discovers during his or her study of the *Path of the Chalice* and plants within himself or herself in the work of qualifying for a *Certificate of Incarnational Study*. It is an affirmation of the connection between a candidate and the spirit and intent of Incarnational Spirituality as uniquely manifest in his or her own life and aspirations.

The program has two parts, the whole lasting eighteen months.

- The first, called the “Time of Calling,” is six months in length and consists of three one-month-long online seminars alternating with three one-month long periods of personal reflection to explore and heighten the candidate’s calling to Ordination and to a Lorian priesthood.
- The second part, the “Time of Unfoldment,” is a year-long time of both instruction in advanced concepts and practices in Incarnational Spirituality, particularly in dealing with the subtle worlds, as well as a personal “vigil” which the candidate undertakes to deepen his or her connection with their own soul and sacredness and with their inner priesthood. This vigil is accompanied by an incarnational project identified by the candidate in consultation with a mentor at the end of the Time of Calling to focus their study and inner work into an active expression of service.

The formal ordination curriculum includes online study with Lorian Faculty and four 3-day, face-to-face weekend programs held in the Seattle, WA area during the Time of Unfoldment . The weekend study themes are intended as a deepening of the six areas covered in the Certificate program as they relate specifically to ordination service.

1. Self, Sacred and Sovereignty
 - Sovereignty: The Call of Selfhood
 - The Nature of Self, Soul, Sacred and the World
2. Altaring Space
 - Ritual and Ceremony
 - Grail Space
 - Holding
3. Incarnational Agency
 - Standing with others
 - Partnering with Allies
4. Subtle Activism
 - The Gaian Self
 - World Work

There will also be periodic online or telephonic seminars to further support and focus the candidate's work and vigil.

In addition to active participation in the face-to-face and online studies, a paper of 8-20 pages or some other equivalent mode of presentation describing the work of the candidate with their ordination project is required.

Cost: \$3,000.00. Travel costs and accommodations for the workshops, the ordination ceremony and incidental costs are additional.

Lorian Faculty & Administration



David Spangler, MCS is Director of the Lorian Center for Incarnational Spirituality. He is a mystic, writer and educator in the integration of spiritual values, energy and presence into everyday life. He was co-director of the Findhorn Community and has taught extensively for over 40 years.

1. Complete the application materials and send by email to: info@Lorian.org or mail to: The Lorian Association, PO Box 1368 Issaquah, WA 98027. Please include a check for \$ 50.00 with your application materials. If accepted this amount covers administration and review. If you are not accepted for any reason \$25.00 will be returned to you with an explanation.

2. Your application will be reviewed by Lorian's ordination committee. A telephone or face-to-face interview may be scheduled between you and a Lorian faculty member or administrator. Following the review a decision will be made regarding acceptance and you will be notified.

B. Academic Background: Please indicate the number years of education you have completed and list any degrees or certificates that you have been awarded.
